After Abbott was cited three more time while feeding the homeless on the beach, his attorney John David on Nov. 12 filed a motion asking the court to enforce the 2001 injunction that allowed the beach feedings, which are in a picnic area adjacent to a public bathroom. Abbott and David contend that court ruling is still valid.

The Fort Lauderdale Food Not Bor group dropped a legal bomb on the ci Thursday, filing a federal lawsuit that claims its free-speech rights are being violated by the city's new homeless for ing regulations. The city is already being sued by Ar

The city is already being sued by Arnold Abbott and the Rev. Mark Sims in Broward Circuit Court to be allowed to continue outdoor feedings. The city ha temporarily stopped enforcing the law while it attempts to find a resolution w

The Food Not Bombs suit is being brought by group members Nathan and Jillian Pim, Haylee Becker and William Tool. Jillian Pim also staged a hunger stelking a repeal of the new city regulations. Food Not Bombs has been holding weekly food sharings in Stranahan Park downtown.


The lawsuit says the city's ordinance is unlawful because it requires members "to apply for and receive a zoning permit to assemble and share food temporarily with each other and members of the public in a city park." The suit says the city rules "have a chilling effect on plaintiffs" exercise of free sneech and associal.

The city regulations say that feeding sites cannot be within 500 feet of each other, that only one is allowed in any given city block and that any site would have to be at least 500 feet away from residential properties. Organizations distributing food outdoors must have permission of the property owner, store the food according to the city's sanitary requirements and provide portable toilest for use by workers and those being fed.
























































# **Summary**
